'LED DOES MORE THAN JUST SAVE ON ENERGY'

"You have to consider not only the costs of LED but also what it gives you. LED can reduce energy consumption, but it also has other advantages such as higher or earlier production."

During the Horti Fair, Philips is turning over its stand to users: floriculture companies from China, tomato growers from Finland and research facility STC/Led4crops and horticulture supplier Cambridge HOK, both from England (see photo). "England wants to become less dependent on import, so LED can provide the solution." There will be another presentation today at the stand (11.0907).
